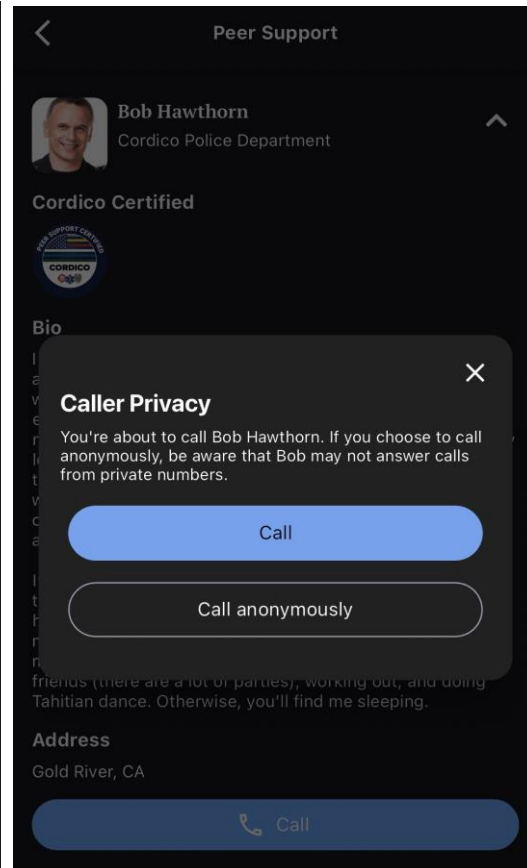


Peer Support and Chaplain Support Team Profile Guidelines & Examples
